VILLAGE OF CAMBRIDGE

LOCAL LAW #2 OF 2000

A LOCAL LAW ENTITLED: "GAMES OF CHANCE LAW OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMBRIDGE"

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Cambridge as follows:

SECTION ONE

TITLE

This Local Law shall be known as the Games of Chance Law of the Village of Cambridge, and may be cited as Village of Cambridge Local Law No. 2 of 2000 ("VOC LL 2000-2").

SECTION TWO

DEFINITIONS

"Authorized Organization" shall mean an "authorized organization" as defined by subdivision 4 of Section 186 of the General Municipal Law.

"Games of Chance" shall mean a "game of chance" as defined in subdivision 3 of Section 186 of the General Municipal Law.

SECTION THREE

GAMES OF CHANCE AUTHORIZED

Authorized Organizations may, upon obtaining a license from the Village Clerk, conduct Games of Chance within the Village of Cambridge, as provided in Article 9-A of the General

Municipal Law and as provided further in this Local Law. Such Games of Chance shall be conducted in accordance with the laws of the State of New York and with the rules and regulations adopted by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and pursuant to this Local Law.

SECTION FOUR

RESTRICTIONS

The conduct of Games of Chance shall be subject to the restrictions imposed by Section 189 of the General Municipal Law.

SECTION FIVE

SUNDAY GAMES

Games of Chance may be conducted on Sunday pursuant to this Local Law. However, no Games of Chance shall be conducted on Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or New Year's Day.

SECTION SIX

ENFORCEMENT


The powers and duties as set forth in Subdivision 1 of Section 194 of the General Municipal Law shall be exercised by the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of the Village of Cambridge, New York.

SECTION SEVEN


EFFECTIVE DATE

This local law shall take effect immediately upon the filing with the Office of the Secretary of State, following its approval by majority of the qualified voters of the Village of Cambridge voting on a proposition therefor, at a general election held pursuant to the provisions of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.


BE IT ENACTED, this 4th day of December, 2000 by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Cambridge, of Washington County, New York.


